The regular quarterly meeting of the Vestry of Westover Parish was held at Sherwood Forest the home of Mr. D. Gardiner Tyler. The following were present. Messrs. Douthat, Sackett, Clark, D.G. J., R. B. Saunders, Bagby, J. A. Tyler, Lewis, A. G. Copland and Dr. Lloyd.

After a delightful dinner we adjourned to the library and Dr. Lloyd opened the meeting with prayer including a prayer for the sick and bereaved in the county.

Mr. Lloyd reported for Hill Carter that we now have 2 - \$1000 G. Bonds at 2 1/4% in the Chelsea Safe Deposit Vault, \$2000.00 in mortgages with Chapin & Clark, \$313.38 in savings acct. and 1282.20 in the checking acct, with rusta and contingent funds all paid.

Mr. P. B. Saunders made a report on his attendance at the Council meeting for the election of a Bishop Coadjutor. He also suggested that resolutions of Sympathy be sent the families of Mr. Hopkins and Miss Lucy Carter and that same should be spread on the minutes and a copy sent to the Southern Churchman. Mr. Saunders and A. G. Copland were designated a committee to do this.

Mr. Pleas. Bagby reported that the minimum amount of insurance should be \$30,000 on the Church and \$25,000 on rectory, outbuildings and contents and that we now have a total of \$34,000. Mr. Bagby moved and it was seconded by Lawrence Lewis that Mr. Clark and Mr. Bagby increase to \$30,000 with extended coverage on \$13,000 the insurance on church & contents.

A. G. Copland moved & it was seconded by J. A. Tyler that Mr. Clark & Bagby also increase to \$20,000 with extended coverage the insurance on Rectory, contents & out buildings.

Mr. Alfred Tyler moved and it was seconded by Mr. Sackett that all honorary members of the Vestry be extended permanently the right to vote in all meetings.

Officers were all relected namely as follows. C. H. Carter Sr. Warden., Arthur Sackett Jr. Warden A. G. Copland Secy and Hill Carter Jr. Treasurer.

## RICHARD BROWN SAUNDERS

Resolution Adopted on May 14, 1952 by the Vestry of Westover Parish

WHEREAS Almighty God in His infinite wisdom called the soul of Richard Brown Saunders to life eternal on March 17, 1952, it is proper for us to take official cognizance of the passing of this gallant gentleman. He was born in the City of Richmond and from early childhood was closely identified with the Episcopal Church. He took pride in the fact that he had been a member of the late choir at All Saints Episcopal Church in that City. In early manhood he was permanently injured as a result of an automobile accident. Shortly thereafter, he moved to Charles City County where he reared a large and happy family at "Glen Cove", surrounded by his faithful and beloved wife and four children.

For more than a third of a century he served faithfully as a member of the Vestry of this Parish, attending the Diocesan Council meetings as a delegate on many occasions and serving as Junior Warden of this Parish.

"Dick" Saunders, as he was affectionately known by his many friends, was a man of high intellect, culture, and refinement. He was spiritually endowed with the human attributes that are befitting a Christian life. He sought happiness by making others happy. He loved people, especially lonely people. Daughter of a Vestryman, sister of another, and mother of a third, she was a lifelong, devoted member of Westover Episcopal Church, giving generously of herself, her means, her time and talents for the betterment of her church and its missions, her home and community.

As a teacher, Sunday School teacher and in her work with a Junior Chapter of the Daughters of the Confederacy she exercised a widespread spiritual influence upon many young people and thus her high ideals will be long perpetuated. Among her outstanding virtues were an integrity that could not be bought, a faith that could not be shaken, undaunted moral and physical courage that never wavered in defending truth and right as she saw them. She possessed a keen sense of humor and vivid powers of description in conversation and writing that made her interesting and long remembered.
